



"There are big prizes on offer at some of these events; it can be very competitive," Cathryn says. "We look for fashions that are on-trend, and the overall look according to the criteria for each event."

But rest assured that you don't need to spend a fortune on designer labels.

"A lot of the girls actually make their own dresses... or they will buy an outfit and then adapt it. They might change something on it or add a bit more to the hem, or take something off the shoulders or the sleeves. They're really quite clever."

So what's hot in 2017? Cathryn tells us, "A lot of the things that are cutting-edge this year are very feminine, like chiffon and flowing type fabrics. On Melbourne Cup Day, it's bold colours and bold patterns and prints and designs... more avant garde fashions."

This year, don't forget to accessorise. Hattinators, bags and shoes are essential. "Millinery is extremely important. Little lace gloves are popular for spring and summer carnivals. You don't have to match everything up anymore, as long as the overall look is well put together."

Big, wide brimmed hats are making a comeback," Cathryn says, "as well as the straw boaters."

Although she lives on the Redcliffe Peninsula, Cathryn will be taking her considerable experience and style to Victoria for all of the Melbourne Cup Carnival racing events this year, held across three tracks and lots of other venues.



Quota International (QI) invites the community to view and judge an eclectic display of Christmas trees, and enjoy its annual Festival of Christmas Trees fundraising event.

epeating their successful event from last year, QI hopes to surpass last year's fundraising efforts in order to help fund programs aligning to their 2016-2017 service theme of 'Sound Beginnings for Children'. Profits from this year's festival will be directed towards the QuoCKa Reading Program in local primary schools, local refuges for women and children, the Cartmill Riding for the Disabled, Hummingbird House Hospice for Children, and the Hear and Say Centre at Ashgrove.

The two-day event will begin with a wine and cheese evening (for invited guests only) on Friday 1st December from 6-8pm where the tree entries will be judged and the Multitude Choir will perform. On Saturday 2nd, the public is encouraged to visit the display from 9am-3pm and vote in the People's Choice category, with the winner being announced at 2.30pm.

There will also be Christmas gift stalls, children's activities, and a raffle. The entry fee of \$5 per person includes three voting tickets, tea, coffee, and cake, with additional votes available at three for \$2.

Publicity Coordinator of QI, Kay Smallhorne, says, "The challenge is to decorate a themed tree which embodies the spirit of Christmas and promotes a particular business or group. By organising an even bigger display of trees this year, we are anticipating some outstanding local talent."

Businesses, schools, organisations, and individuals are encouraged to decorate a themed tree in a creative fashion to be displayed, judged and voted for by the public for the Festival. Trees can be decorated in the form of colour, items used to create or decorate the tree, the shape and design of the tree itself, or can generate an idea or have a message.

Being held in Webb Hall at the Redcliffe Showgrounds, it promises to be an exciting, family event to help share the spirit of Christmas giving.

We are aiming for our Festival to become a much anticipated and loved Christmas event that is embraced by the whole community at a time which is all about caring and giving to those less fortunate than ourselves,"

Driving into its 8th year, Brisbane Convoy for Kids, will once again dazzle the crowds with all things big and bold, raising funds for kids in need on Saturday 4th November.

tarting at 9.30am in Forest Lake, an assortment of heavy vehicles will drive along the Logan and Gateway Motorway, Deagon Deviation, over the Houghton Highway Bridge, along the Redcliffe foreshore and up Oxley Avenue, finishing at the Redcliffe Showgrounds at approximately 10.30am, where spectators will be able to view all the vehicles and partake in the day's festivities.

From entertainment, presentations, displays, children's activities, and fireworks, it promises to be a fun day out for all the family.

Treasurer of the event, Leanne Dinning, says, "Kids, big and small, are enthralled by the size, colour, and sounds of the big rigs as they pass by in the convoy, decorated and flying flags. And once at the Redcliffe Showgrounds, families can enjoy free rides, a petting zoo, stalls, singers, bands and dancers on the main stage, an auction, a truck tug-of-war, dunking tanks, a bucking bull, and a bar, with the night concluding at 10.30pm."

Vehicles taking part on the day include big and small trucks, fire trucks, tow trucks, utes, ambulances, and buses, and there are numerous spots on the Peninsula to view the progress of the convoy such as Pelican Park and along Oxley Avenue. Leanne says, "Locals sometimes set up BBQs and sunshades to watch, but we just ask for people not to stop on the Logan or Gateway Motorways as it's not safe."

With proceeds going to children's hospice, Hummingbird House, to help support families of children with life-limiting conditions, Brisbane Convoy for Kids aims to create a fun-filled family day out.

"Brisbane Convoy for Kids is a magical day for everyone," says Leanne.

"Whilst we are raising funds for kids in need, we are also raising a positive image for the men and women of the transport industry. It costs the average entrant in the convoy about \$300 to partake, plus time to get the vehicle ready, but just seeing a smile on a child's face is all we ask for on the day."





The restaurant is unique because of its size and décor, which now has a real crisp, clean look and not the old 1970s bowls clubs of the past," he says.



fter extensive community consultation and engagement, Moreton Bay Regional Council has unveiled its muchanticipated Redcliffe Foreshore Master Plan and Activation Strategy.


The master plan will promote business and tourism across nine locations from Clontarf to Newport, with the trial and inclusion of food trucks, pop-up vendors, food markets, car shows, annual events and even an inflatable water park.

Mayor Allan Sutherland says the master plan would unlock exciting economic development opportunities for new and existing businesses and spark job growth for residents.

"Private inflatable water park operators have already indicated to council that they'll be hiring local lifeguards to help run the park, and for our brick-and-mortar shops already on the foreshore, the master plan is a chance for them to extend their footprint through to the shore," Cr Sutherland says.

The new foreshore master plan adds another element to our vibrant foreshore areas for residents and the more than 2.9 million annual visitors who help generate more than \$670 million for our local businesses."


Moreton Bay Regional Council Division 5 Councillor James Houghton says residents, visitors and businesses in Redcliffe have long been champing at the bit for new opportunities at foreshore areas.



"Council has adopted a plan to accommodate new pop-up activities along the Peninsula," he says.

"Redcliffe's scenic views, family-friendly atmosphere and close proximity to the rest of South East Queensland make it one of the most sought after destinations for visitors.

"It is exactly why paddle-board operators and other similar vendors have been approaching council to set up their business here."



Cr Houghton says businesses said the current system for temporary activities was cumbersome and restrictive.

"We're creating a new streamlined process for businesses to be pre-approved, so they can operate easily across a number of beaches and foreshore areas."

Things are bound to get wet'n'wild if a trial of an inflatable water park this summer becomes a regular feature on the Redcliffe waterfront.

Moreton Bay Regional Council Division 6 Councillor Koliana Winchester says the inflatable water park trial at Pelican Park would hopefully include many of the popular equipment such as slides and other jumping elements usually found at aqua parks, plus new amusements exclusive to Redcliffe.

"Council is now working with the State Government and water park operators to finalise a trial, hopefully in time for the Christmas school holidays," Cr Winchester says.

"During consultation on our foreshore master plan, the community overwhelmingly told us they wanted an inflatable water park on the Peninsula "

Cr Winchester says the water park will align with community values and positively impact local businesses.

"Beyond the fun and excitement of swings,

slides and trampolines, an inflatable water park will generate local jobs and bring new visitors who will spend money at our local restaurants. cafes and businesses," she says.

"If the trial is successful, we're hoping to be able to implement something in the long term not only in Redcliffe but elsewhere in Moreton Bay."

Cr Sutherland says the council conducted two consultation periods, including sessions with business owners.

More than 600 residents completed surveys and another 200 shared their ideas for the new plan.

"Survey respondents told us they felt strongly about the inclusion of an inflatable water park." he says.



Council has adopted the Redcliffe Foreshore Master Plan following a survey completed by more than 600 residents, while another 200 shared their ideas for the new plan during the consultation period. The policy

applies to 15km and 30 parks on the Redcliffe foreshore and describes the activities and businesses that can be set up at each of the major foreshore areas. As a result, Council will be working with the State Government and private operators to trial a GIANT inflatable water park at Clontarf, which was the most popular suggestion by residents.

Under the new master plan, places like Suttons Beach will be able to offer deck chair and umbrella hire, while areas like Bicentennial Park at Woody Point can be used for Eat Street-style markets. A new dog off leash area will also be trialled at Queens Beach, Scarborough.

It is hoped the plan would complement existing businesses and retain the character of each of the nine key locations. New businesses will not be allowed to set up within 500 metres of an existing competing business.

management, staff and patients for the opening of the newly completed Cancer Care Services and Day Treatment Unit, and the Kidney Health Services and Redcliffe Dialysis Unit at the Moreton Bay Integrated Care Centre (MBICC). The relocation of these services to MBICC permits work to commence on a 26-bed acute care ward on level 6 of the hospital. Work is also underway to construct two replacement Day Procedure rooms, refurbish sterilising service and pathology areas, and undertake a major upgrade of the hospital's electrical infrastructure.

We have restored frontline services with 137 extra nurses and midwives, 25 extra doctors and 23 allied health workers employed at Redcliffe Hospital during this term of government.

I have also successfully advocated for the State Government to finance and build a new multi-storey car park at Redcliffe Hospital, to be operated by the Hospital and Health Service. This will enable us to contain car parking costs to about \$15 per day with concessions available for eligible patients, carers and staff.

Plastic Bag Ban Set for Queensland

Redcliffe parks and foreshores will be cleaner places, and our local wildlife safer when Queensland introduces the Container Refund Scheme and the Lightweight Plastic Shopping Bag Ban from 1st July 2018.

vette D'Ath, Member for Redcliffe, said the Waste Reduction and Recycling Amendment Bill 2017 was passed by State Parliament on 5 September 2017, with bipartisan support.

"By passing this Bill we say to our young people that we value our wildlife, especially our marine creatures like turtles, sea birds and dugongs" Mrs D'Ath said.

We say that we want our parks, our waterways, Moreton Bay and the Great Barrier Reef to be litter free."

Lightweight plastic bag bans are already operating in South Australia, the Northern Territory, Tasmania and the ACT, and similar container refund schemes have been in place in South Australia and the Northern Territory for many years. Once the scheme comes into effect in Queensland, most containers between 150ml and 3litres will be eligible for a 10cent refund when they are returned to designated container refund points across the state.

Tony Crudgington from the Redcliffe Environmental Forum sees great value in the introduction of the schemes. "We see a lot of discarded rubbish washed ashore or running through the drains. This is absolutely a step in the right direction."

Redcliffe Coast Guard Flotilla Commander Lee McCarthy agrees, saying, "The reduction in plastic bags and bottles would see a reduction in marine wildlife becoming entangled with plastic bags and harmed. With the container refund scheme we would hope to see a great reduction in the amount of plastic bottles and containers dumped on our foreshore, which creates not only an eyesore but a risk to our wildlife once it enters the waterway."

Besides the benefits to the environment and wildlife, the scheme will also provide opportunities to community groups, schools, charities and social enterprise organisations to raise funds through the collection of empty containers.

A Pathway to Preserve & Protect



Redcliffe residents are one step closer to seeing 'up-close' the unique natural beauty that Hay's Inlet, near the Hornibrook Bridge, has to offer. ony Crudgington of the Redcliffe Environmental Forum has been involved in the Clontarf Eco-Path project since its inception. "We've been working towards this since around 2010, "Tony said.

The planned Eco-Path will provide a pathway and boardwalk that allows both locals and tourists to experience the original environment of the area.

Spearheaded by the Redcliffe Environmental Forum, it will provide educational opportunities for local schools and residents, as well as protecting our local wildlife and environment for future generations.







Moreton Bay Regional Council is partnering with Redcliffe Environmental Forum in the project and has helped us gain federal funding. There's been a lot of lobbying involved and Luke Howarth MP has been a great supporter," Tony says.

The Redcliffe Environmental Forum and the Green Army have already done a lot of work towards the preservation and restoration of this area. "There is a temporary pathway in there

now; the next stage is getting council engineers on site and having testing and design work done".

In Tony's words, "We saw value in putting this pathway through because it's the last piece of what Redcliffe was; the only way to protect it was to make sure the public understand the value that it has, so that in the future it will still be there. That's the vision."

The Hay's Inlet site is the only remaining place on the peninsula where the original Eucalypt, Casuarina, Melaleuca, Saltmarsh and Mangrove Forest profiles can still be observed in one walk, and will provide and preserve habitat for endangered and threatened species including the Koala, the Eastern Curlew and the Australian Painted Snipe.

The Green Army and the Redcliffe Environmental Forum thrive on volunteer input and assistance, and welcome new members.






Following the opening of the Hornibrook Highway in 1935, a proposal by Hornibrook Highway Ltd to construct a shark-proof swimming enclosure at Clontarf received unanimous support from Redcliffe Town Council in December 1937.

uilt the following year and officially opened in December 1938, this pool was a shark-proof enclosure situated about 400 yards from the Clontarf end of the Hornibrook Bridge, 1,000 feet from high water mark, and 400 feet wide. A platform ran the whole length of the southern boundary and across the seaward end of the enclosure, with three resting platforms and four springboards.

A dressing Pavilion and Cafe were erected on the opposite side of Hornibrook Esplanade necessitating the construction of a subway for access to the beach. The pavilion was described as an attractive building with an imposing concrete entrance and tiled roof. There were 200 lockers and 20 cubicles in the women's section, and 250 lockers and six cubicles in the Men's section.

A bathing pavilion was on the opposite side of the Hornibrook Highway with a viaduct so that you could dress in the bathing pavilion on one side and then walk under the Hornibrook Esplanade to the bathing enclosure." — *Greg Enright*

In 1946 Hornibrook Highway Ltd. announced the sale of the company's swimming enclosure to Harry William Wightman and Percy and Eldine Thompson. Extensive alterations were carried out so that the cafe and dressing rooms became The Chalet cafe and dining room.

While remaining a popular fishing spot, the bathing enclosure gradually fell into disrepair until finally being removed in the early 1960s.

NEW CANCER CARE AND KIDNEY HEALTH SERVICES AT REDCLIFFE

Redcliffe and district residents requiring long term care for conditions such as kidney disease and cancer will now have options for enhanced treatment closer to home following the opening of new state-of-the-art facilities at the Moreton Bay Integrated Care Centre (MBICC) on the Redcliffe Hospital campus.

The Attorney-General and Member for Redcliffe Yvette D'Ath was joined by the Minister for Health, patients and their support representatives, Metro North HHS management, doctors, nurses and clinicians to celebrate the opening of the hospital's new \$8.1 million Cancer Care Services and Day Treatment Unit, and the Kidney Health Services and Redcliffe Dialysis Unit.

Mrs D'Ath said that she was delighted everything about these new facilities has been designed with high standards of patient care and comfort in mind.

The first thing that strikes you as you walk into these facilities is the way they have been designed to make the most of the natural light and those stunning views across the Peninsula and Moreton Bay".



The nature of treatments for renal patients is such that patients will often spend many hours at each treatment, several times a week. In their new facility, these patients will have improved comfort and access to personal televisions, while they receive their treatments. The new facilities have also been designed to make the important work of Redcliffe's nursing, pharmacy, and clinical staff easier.

Redcliffe Hospital provides health care services to a rapidly growing part of South East Queensland, and the new facilities will help ensure that health infrastructure keeps pace with that growth. The new Cancer Care facility is delivering chemotherapy treatments for between 150 and 200 patients each week; and providing 250 and 300 patient appointments in their outpatient clinics. Kidney Health Services are provided in conjunction with the Royal Brisbane and

Women's Hospital with the Redcliffe facility supporting 40 patients with 120 treatments each week.

These new facilities represent a significant State Government investment in modernising health care services at Redcliffe and improving the quality of care that the hospital provides to the community. Now that these cancer care and kidney health services are established at their new facilities in MBICC. the hospital is moving forward with other infrastructure modernisation, including an \$8.1 million project to construct a new 26-bed acute care ward on level 6 of the hospital, a \$6.6 million refurbishment of the Day Procedure Unit, and \$7.4 million upgrade of the hospital's electrical infrastructure. In addition, planning is underway for the construction of a new multi-storey carpark at the hospital.



Winnie Luk's vivid colours explore the range of what the sky offers, in oils, through to her explosions of feeling in her acrylic abstracts.


Keri McSweeny's works present her insightful play of geometric forms alongside natural formations in the environment, through oils.

Further to last month's report, which noted property analyst Terry Ryder's long-term prediction of growth for the region from back in 2015; it is no surprise that this view has been bolstered by Moreton Bay earning a spot in the latest Hotspotting National Top Ten Best Buys in 2017 report.


