




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PICKING YOUR WEDDING DATE

Congratulations! You're engaged and now the real work begins

Before you get to planning all the details of your big day, you first have to decide when that day will be. The most important factor for most couples is the time of year. In my professional opinion, choosing a wedding date based solely on the seasons will inevitably lead to problems in planning your big day. Likewise, choosing a date based on sentiment may also lead to difficulties. Whether you've selected your date because it's the day your grandparents were married, or because it was the first available date you and your groom could get vacation time, it is best to consider the following tips before setting the date.

First, check your finances. Do you have enough to be able to get all the things you want without going into debt or adding undue stress to your relationship? You will want to give parents or anyone helping you pay for the wedding enough time to get their finances in order, also. Deciding on what you can and are willing to spend will help determine if you'll be taking a trip down the aisle with 300 of your closest friends and family, or a trip to the courthouse to see the Justice of the Peace. Once you have a handle on what you want to spend, and are able to save, select a date that allows you to pay everything off at least 30 days in advance. This will ensure you have nothing but wonderful memories the month leading up to your wedding day.

Second, check the availability. If you have your heart set on getting married in the church, this is an especially important step. Many churches are booked months or years in advanced for special occasions and programs. To avoid disappointment, it's best to check first to see what dates are available. The same is true for your reception venue.

Finally, check with your family. A wedding is a celebration of a bride and groom joining in holy matrimony or a civil service before family and friends. It will be in your best interest to run whatever dates you are considering by the people who mean the most to you to be sure they can attend. This is not asking for your family's approval on the date, but more a courtesy to be sure they haven't already made plans that can't be changed. It may seem like a lot to consider for such a simple task like choosing a wedding day, but taking these issues into consideration before setting the date will definitely increase your chances of choosing a perfect wedding date.

- Start a wedding folder or binder. Begin leafing through bridal, lifestyle, fashion, gardening, design, and food magazines for inspiration.
- Arrange for parents to get together and meet each other if they haven't already.
- Pick a special date to begin your lives together.
- Work out your budget. Determine how much you have to spend, based on your families' contributions and your own. Pick your wedding party. As soon as you're engaged, people will start wondering who's in.
- Interview wedding planners if you're using one.
- Pick the ceremony site and meet with the officiant. Map out the ceremony and confirm that you have all the official documents for the wedding (these vary by county and religion).
- Start the guest list. Make a head count database to use throughout your planning process, with columns for contact info, RSVPs, gifts, and any other relevant information. Download form at stwmagazine.com
- Visit reception sites and reserve one.
- Begin shopping for your wedding gown.
- If you want to drop a few pounds for the wedding start now.

SUGGESTION: When calling references, be sure to ask if it is a good time to be calling the previous client. Limit your questions as not to over impose or take up too much of their time. (No more than 15 minutes)

GETTING IT TOGETHER: LEAVE IT TO THE PRO'S

My parents were married 53 years ago. They had cake and punch at my maternal grandmother's house and they looked radiant in the photos I have from the Big Day. I'm sure Grandma made the cake and sweets from scratch... I'm having trouble writing as I'm tearing up just thinking about it... so precious and so sweet! If you are having a small reception in the same location or one close to the ceremony, it is very possible that you and your family can handle everything along with the church or temple coordinator. But, if you are planning to spend upwards of \$25,000.00, get a veteran wedding planner on your side! Not only is peace of mind worth some bucks, but a seasoned wedding planner can help ensure your budget is maintained, and help you avoid making financially-costly mistakes!

I urge you to avoid learning after the fact, because once you've had your wedding and you've gone through the experience to learn what it is all about, then you'll know why having an expert on your side is needed.

Today, I compare weddings to a movie production, but with only a onetime run through. In a large production, there is always the need for a "go to" person to arrange everything and keep the show under control during execution.

From my initial "What I Do First?" list, there are 54 entries of pre-wedding things I count on needing to be done, not to mention any extraneous items from each person's needs... and these are just the pre-wedding details, now imagine it is the week of your wedding. Your family starts to arrive from Sunday to Tuesday; everything begins to be turned upside down. You have all kinds of last minute things you want to do and now most certainly, you don't have the time as your family and friends want you to go to a Hooks game or a day at the beach.

Where the real action is, is on the day of the wedding. This is when it's truly action-packed as far as details. For most weddings, set up begins before makeup; leaving vendors with the need of a point person to fine tune what is live and happening. Most of a coordinator's time during the last two weeks of wedding planning is spent refining time line adjustments for vendor time in/out, confirming time for highlights (like cake cutting), etc. as there are always last minute changes once everything plays out.

Along with all of the aforementioned items to attend to, imagine the bride being a consummate hostess with a smile plus having to handle the RSVP management, wedding rehearsal execution, guest list management, guest's umpteen million questions that roll in all day long, transportation organization, amenity distribution.... A mad woman would be an easier role for a bride left alone! But when you have someone you can trust working on your behalf, available to call, text and e-mail like a maniac to get what needs to get done, done, you have the comfort to actually relax, and enjoy your wedding day.

THE SAND CEREMONY MAKES FOR LOVELY BEACH WEDDING

The Sand Ceremony, with its possible origin in Hawaii, is a lovely alternative to the Unity Candle Ceremony, especially if your wedding is to take place on a beach. As the Unity Candle, the Sand Ceremony is performed after the vows. The symbolism is similar in that the "two shall become one."

You can purchase sand in various colors (to match your color scheme!) along with two smaller glass containers for the bride and groom and one larger glass container representing your marriage, relationship and new life.

If you have children, your children may also participate by pouring some sand into the container as well.

Written notes can be read by the officiant and then placed into the bottle, a favorite of mine is William Blake.

"(Bride) and (Groom) your lives are now joined in the most sacred and joyous of unions. We pray that your life be blessed. In the immortal words of the poet mystic William Blake, together may you...


Sand Ceremony Vows

"(Bride) and (Groom), you have just committed yourselves to one another through sacred vows. Your lives are no longer two, but one. To symbolize this joining, we ask that you each pour some sand into this bottle. (Each scoops some sand from the beach and pours it into the bottle)." *Officiant:* (Name) and (Name) as you pour your sand into the one container, please repeat after me: "As these grains of sand merge together as one, I merge my life with yours. Please take my love throughout the sands of time. My heart is forever in your keeping.

Officiant: (Name) and (Name) as these grains of sand are joined together, so are your hearts, your bodies and your souls in marriage. Please repeat after me: (Here the nuptial pair may add whatever vows they wish....)

"My beloved (Name) as these grains of sand are joined together, so are our hearts, our bodies and our souls. I offer myself as your husband/wife forever."

For children: "(Children's name/s) your mother (and/or father) and (name) love you very much, and want you to know that you are and will always be a very important part of their lives. Will you please pour some sand into this glass container along with your good wishes? That would mean so much to them." (Parents then hug and kiss their children!)

The Dress

The first known white wedding dress was worn in 1499 by Anne of Brittany, for her marriage to Louis XII of France.

Until that time, women simply wore their best dress, often yellow or red in color. In biblical times, most dresses were blue because blue symbolized purity. But in China and Japan the brides have traditionally always worn white.

White is the color of mourning, which is thought to be appropriate as the bride is leaving her family of birth to join that of her husband's thereby undergoing a symbolic death. Since early Roman times, white symbolized a joyful celebration. In the twentieth century white stood for purity. Today it is a symbol of happiness.

Bachelor Party

This was the last chance before his new wife took over the finances for the groom to gather money by gambling for his own future use. Ancient Spartan soldiers were the first to hold stag parties.

The groom would feast with his male friends on the night before the wedding. There he would say good-bye to the carefree days of bachelorhood and swear continued allegiance to his comrades.

Ritual Bath



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

MY BUDGET:

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM YOUR PHOTOGRAPHER



Demand Professionalism: Make sure the appointments you set are with reputable professionals. Take note right from the beginning about how you are treated on the phone and how soon you get a call back if you leave a message. The little things make a big difference. Never forget, this is a service business. Also, make sure that wedding photography is at least 50% of the photographer's business.

Portfolio: Ask to see the photographer's work. Make sure that the person whose work you are viewing will be the one actually photographing your wedding. Ask to see work from an entire wedding, preferably an album or a set of proofs from a recent wedding they have photographed. Look for examples of styles that you would like to see in your wedding images.

Ask About Prices and Services: Find out what type of services are offered, such as how many hours of the photographer's time are included in the price and what his/her overtime rate is. Ask how many images you will get back, and if the price will include black and white film as well as color. Does the package price include an engagement sitting and, if not, how much does a sitting cost? The most important thing to know up front is what the package price does and does not include.

Unity Candle

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

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

LET THE 'MOON OVER MORAVIA,' LIGHT UP YOUR SPECIAL DAY WITH ITS NOSTALGIC FLAIR

Moravia Store is located on FM 957 between Schulenburg and Hallettsville. In 1889 Ignac (I.E.) Jalufka built a two story frame saloon on this site. Grocery and Mercantile supplies took up the rear of the ground floor. The saloon was located in the front. The second floor served as a dance hall. Masquerades, seasonal celebrations and other events made it a popular gathering place for the entire community.

The second story was torn down leaving the one story Moravia Store. The Moravia Store remained open until 1990 then store closed for the first time in 109 years, but it was reopened in 1996. "The Moravia Store was reopened on May 1, 1996 to





new owners Henrietta and Leroy Rehak, then my husband got real sick and died of cancer in July" Henrietta says. "Before he died he made me promise that I would keep the store going as long as I could. It was slow going at first, but it really picked up since. In February of 1998 Henrietta was remarried to Franklin Filip.

The store has an old wooden floor and the display cases are originals. The walls are covered with old beer signs, photographs, license plates, serving trays and soft drink advertisement. The old meat market is now the pool room. Mrs. Filip has placed a red caboose next to the store, filled with Coca-Cola memorabilia.

The store has become somewhat popular for the song "Moon Over Moravia", by local songwriter Daniel Klapuch and Mark Hermes. Like the song says, "957 leads right to the door."

Besides the cold liquid refreshments, the store also makes hamburgers with french fries and onion rings, cooked by Henrietta's husband Frankie. Also, they have live music on Fridays or Saturday Nights. Henrietta tries to have a band at least once a month.

The Moravia Store also makes reservations for your special event. Call and make your appointment today. Also, if you would like to take your wedding pictures or any portraits, call ahead of time. The store can be reached at 979-562-2217.









Want a country-style wedding with rusticity and charm by the bucketful? Envisioning a glorious ride for two around the hay field? See yourself gliding down the aisle in a fresh-as-summer cotton eyelet gown?

Back to the Land

Start with a palette of earthy tones: yellows and golds, tans and umbers, sage and russet, celadon and cinnamon. Then, try building the theme around your favorite rustic flower (like sunflowers, black-eyed susans or daisies), or a carefree member of the insect world, such as bees, butterflies or dragonflies.

If you're lucky enough to be holding your event in a barn or a lodge, wrap any rafters and pillars in elegant twinkle lights. Make good use of square hay bales by covering them with cloth and using them as benches.

To jazz up personal focal points like favors and place settings, start with raffia ties and cinnamon sticks, individual wheat stalks or lavender springs, or Mason jars, burlap bags and small pots of jam or honey.

Country-Style Centerpieces

It's simple to set the table with a little down-home glory. Candles are inherently rustic, so start there: tea lights floating in water-filled mason jars, for example. Or tuck pillar candles into terra cotta pots, or place in glass cylinders filled with popcorn, dried peas or coffee beans. Casual flowers make a big, joyous statement at a reasonable price. Try massing cheerful sunflowers in galvanized pails or watering cans. (You can even use a sunflower's enormous, friendly face as your ring pillow.) Or instead of sunflowers, try sprays of shasta daisies, lupine and viburnum mixed in with small green apples wired to birch branches, or stuck to dowels. Another popular choice: group colorful Gerber daisies into simple mason jars.

More Ways to Make it Country

Give your guests an adorable first impression by hanging escort cards from clothespins on a clothesline near the entrance. Once it's time to eat, dress up the chair backs at the sweetheart table with dramatic sheaves of wheat tied off with russet ribbons or roses. And if your main meal's held outside, you could set the stage with homey touches like buffet or serving tables made from planks set on hay bales and sawhorses.

Today's professional DJ is much more than just a few turntables and a couple of speakers. The modern DJ of today has traded his LP Records for CD's and MP3's. He has the stateof-the-art system that will rock a wedding like nobody's business. He has lights, lasers and other visual effects that will keep you dancing much longer than your legs want you to. Some DJ's incorporate video screens for added visual flavor and even dress up like Spongebob Squarepants, if the price is right.

1. Establish your budget

This part is extremely crucial. Remember, great entertainment is NOT cheap. In "DJ World", you get what you pay for. With that said, it's important to mention to your DJ how many people will be at the event and what you will require of him, so he can give you a price for his services.

2. Meet the talent

Disc Jockey Services are a big business! Now that there are many different Entertainment Providers to choose from, you will want to meet the actual DJ that will host the music for your event. Don't leave this to chance. If you are calling an Entertainment Company, insist that you meet the individual who will be at your event.

3. Services

Establish what type of services you will need from your DJ. Do you want bubbles floating over you and your guests while you're exiting the Church? Would you like your entire hall lit up with intense blue and purple lights? Do you need "snow machines" for your Winter Wonderland Wedding? Will your DJ make announcements throughout your event (MC)?

4. Itinerary

The DJ shall then play the music you have chosen for the event or you may leave the music to him. A great DJ will be able to read the crowd and play music that your guests will enjoy dancing to. Please keep in mind that the music you choose might not be what your guests wish to hear. Hiring a DJ with an extensive library of music and that can adapt to suit the needs of your guests is key. Ask for references!

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WEDDING DAY QUALITY: THE LOST ART

Many brides base every wedding vendor decision on one thing: price. Nostalgia


Your wedding video would begin with photos of the bride and groom as small children. It might show a photo slideshow with high school and college photographs, and progress to the beginning of the relationship, showing special moments the couple shared while dating. The video goes into scenes from the wedding ceremony, reception, and ends with shots from the honeymoon.

Documentary

A documentary representation is often thought of as an 'as-it-happened' editing style. It is all-inclusive and assures that every moment captured is faithfully portrayed. The multiple angles are blended, titles are applied and background music is added. The running time can vary from 75 minutes to 120 minutes depending on the lengths of the ceremony, toasts and dance floor events.

Cinematic

Through time-shifting, time-compression, creative use of audio overlays and tight integration with carefully selected music, cinematic editing is able bring out the emotion, highlight the humor and keep the viewer entertained without the feeling that something has been left out.

Meet and Eat

You and your fiancé, and maybe even a food-savvy third party, should be able to sample some of the chefs' signature dishes (note that there may be a fee involved). You can expect the food to look precisely the way it will at your reception. So if the salad is meant to be garnished with flowers, you should have them for the tasting, and they should look fresh. That said, seasonal items you plan to serve may not be available at the time of the tasting, so you'll have to imagine how those dishes will ultimately look and taste. Though you shouldn't expect a total overhaul of a recipe, don't hesitate to make suggestions or to ask the chef if spices or subtle elements can be modified to suit your taste.

Wine While You Dine

Let caterers know before tastings that you'd like to sample the wines that will be served with the wedding meal. If you don't like the way the cabernet sauvignon goes with your food, ask to taste-test another wine. Don't get hung up on which wine should go with what food, however—the best choices are those you, your fiancé and your guests will enjoy drinking.

Put It On Paper

You'll need a written contract—not just a verbal agreement—spelling out the date, time, fees and specific menu items. Both you and the vendor must sign this to make it binding. The number of guests may change at the last minute, so be sure to agree on a deadline for your final count.

Get It To-Go


Ironically, after all the time and energy you've put into planning the meal, you may not even have a spare second to eat during the reception. Ask your caterer to pack a basket for you and your new hubby so that you can devour it later, back in the hotel room. You deserve to enjoy the meal, too!

SERVING LIQUOR:

Make sure your caterer has a liquor license if he or she will be responsible for providing and maintaining the alcohol for your reception. If your caterer doesn't, then you need to contact a liquorlicensed dealer. It's also important to have an experienced bartender throughout the entire reception.





MARRYING FOOD & DRINK

Chardonnay is one of the most popular white wines. It has an impressive range of flavors—butter, oak, apple, pear, citrus, and melon—and can have a long finish. Chardonnay can go very well with poultry, white meat and cream sauce as well as with Brie and Camembert cheeses.

Sauvignon Blanc, also known as Fumé Blanc, can be high in acid and very crisp, dry and sometimes grassy, with an aroma of grapefruit, lime, melon, gooseberry, passion fruit and a little bell pepper. It goes well with sea food, fish and salad.

Merlot is the safest choice of the red wines. In general, Merlots are softer wines with lots of fruit flavors like plum, black cherry, orange blossom and violet. It goes well with red meat, red pasta, chicken and chocolate.

Cabernet Sauvignon is known as one of the world's finest red wines. It has depth, complexity and rich flavor like black currant, blackberry and mint. Traditionally aged in oak for five to ten years, this wine has a tobacco finish, and in cold climates it has what we call a funky finish, a touch of bell pepper or cabbage. Cabernet will pair well with game, lamb, red meat, heavy cheeses and dark chocolate.

Pinot Noir is one of the most difficult grapes to grow. It needs warm days and cool nights. Its most notable components are cherry and strawberry and it is very versatile in its ability to pair up with food.

Zinfandel, an American classic, is one of my favorite wines, next to Pinot Noir. Zinfandel is a spicy peppery wine with fruity flavors like berries and dark cherry. It matches well with thick red sauces, red meats, and cheeses like stilton and cambozola, and should be served at a temperature of 65 degrees.

Champagne/Sparkling Wines are the wines of celebration and they are a perfect way to start your hors d'oeuvre party caviar, foie gras, smoked salmon, poultry, lobster and scallops. They are also great with chocolate-covered strawberries and chocolate truffles.

Cheese and Wine: are a perfect match. In general, hard cheeses are better paired with red wines and softer cheeses with white wine. Another rule is that stronger cheeses pair well with heavier wines and delicate cheeses with lighter wines.

Purchase wedding shoes and start dress fittings. Bring the shoes along to your first fitting so the tailor can choose the appropriate length for your gown.

10 THINGS TO **Avoid** as You plan your wedding

1 A Lack of Personality

The biggest mistake I see is a wedding devoid of the couple's own personalities. I'm not saying everyone must have a theme wedding, but a cookie-cutter wedding and reception is unimaginative, and you may regret it later. This is the most important day of your life – it should reflect your life and what is important to you both.

2 Wasting Money

The wedding industry is just that – an industry. So while there is a lot of good advice, there is also advice from people who'll profit from it. Be careful you're not spending money where you don't need to – prioritize your wish list and stick with the plan. Make sure you know your budget, what's important to you – and what isn't.

3 A Wedding is a Day, A Marriage is Forever

The wedding ceremony is the main event – the reception is just a celebration of it. Make sure you've put enough thought into the music, readings, and vows that will make your wedding ceremony memorable. Take the time to discuss the roles you and your partner will take up after the wedding, topics such as children, holidays, religion, education and expectations for the future.

4 Not Knowing the Master of Ceremonies

There are two people whose personalities are almost as important as the couple getting married – they are the MC of the ceremony (often the officiant) and the MC of the reception (often the DJ or band leader.) Let's face it, if your officiant is boring and dry, your wedding ceremony is going to be boring and dry. And if your DJ is super cheesy, you're going to be doing the chicken dance. Make sure that your personalities mesh well with these two people, and that you feel listened to and respected.

5 Thinking "It Could Never Rain"

So many couples forget to plan for things going wrong. If you're having an outdoor wedding, make sure that you have an alternate location in case of rain. Give a trusted person a list of vendors, phone numbers, and expected time of arrival so that you won't be caught 10 minutes before the wedding without the bouquets. Bring a bridal emergency kit for last minute snafus.



6 Losing Your "Budget"

You started off well, figuring how much you could save, how much parents would give, and what you already had in your bank account. But before you know it, you could spend twice what you budgeted for apparel on shoes alone, and the caterers laughed at you when you told them the food budget. Use the budget as a tool to figure out what you can cut, what you can save and where other income might come from.

7 Overindulging Before the Wedding

Whether your friends have mistakenly planned the bachelor/ bachelorette parties for the night before the wedding, or you plan to drink through the rehearsal dinner, the last thing you need is to wake up with a headache, puffy skin, fuzzy head, or worse, an upset stomach. Do yourself a favor, skip drinking the night before.

8 Being Inconsiderate

Yes, it's your wedding, and your special day. However, you will need to take other people into consideration as well. A good host/ hostess puts others needs front and center. Think about what you are asking.

Is what you need the wedding party to do fair? Have you been clear about your expectations about level of commitment? Will your guests be forced to stand around for over an hour while you take pictures? Will they be comfortable in the weather or have you thought to provide bottles of water, fans, and/or wraps and heaters?

9 Not Involving Your Better Half

Wedding planning can and should be the domain of both people, rather than just de facto delegated to the bride. I suggest setting aside a regular weekly meeting time to talk about new ideas, research that you've done, and set wedding-related goals for the next week.

10 Losing Perspective

Don't forget to keep your eye on what's really important to you. Don't get bogged down in so many small details that you don't spend enough time on what's important. If something goes wrong, try your best to take deep breaths and think about the big picture. Above all, keep your sense of humor!



Work on the seating arrangements for the reception.

E-mail and print directions for drivers of transport vehicles. This gives chauffeurs time to navigate a route.

Assign seating. Draw out table shapes on a layout of the room to help plan place settings. Write the names of female guests on pink sticky notes and the names of male guests on blue sticky notes so you can move people about without re-sketching the entire setting.

- Confirm times for hair and makeup and all vendors.
- Purchase bridesmaids' gifts for rehearsal dinner.
- Get your hair cut and colored, if desired.
- Enter RSVPs into your guest-list database.
- Phone people who have not yet responded.
- Stock the bar. Now that you have a firm head count you can order accordingly.

Visit the dressmaker for your last dress fitting. For peace of mind, you may want to schedule a fitting the week of your wedding. You can always cancel the appointment if you try on the dress then and it fits perfectly.

- $\mathcal T$ Send out as many final payments as you can.
- Get final beauty treatments (manicure, facial, massage, waxing, brow shaping, etc.).
- Get your marriage license. The process can take up to six days, but it's good to give yourself some leeway.

Book a spa treatment. Make an appointment for a manicure and a pedicure the day before the wedding. (You might want to get a stress-relieving massage, too.)

Send the final guest list to the caterer and all venues hosting your wedding-related events at least 72 hours before. Break in your shoes. Assemble and distribute the welcome baskets.

Pack for the honeymoon.




Bridal Flowers

- Apply concealer to banish dark circles under your eyes.
- Matte eyeshadows are photo-ready.
- Use an off-white matte shadow along your brow bone if you have light skin, or peach if you have dark skin, to illuminate your eyes even more.
- Blend well, especially at the corners of your eyes.
- Define your brows with a pencil or powder that matches your hair color.
- Wear at least two layers of mascara.
- Use an eyelash curler before and after applying your first coat of mascara.








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
The Next Day

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
